la **léiomyomatose intraveineuse** est une prolifération tumorale musculaire lisse bénigne rare , rencontrée **exclusivement chez la femme de race blanche** , avec une **histoire d'hystérectomie pour fibromyomes utérins** .

elle naît soit d'une prolifération leiomyomateuse utérine proche d'une veine pelvienne soit directement en intravasculaire (des cas ont été décrits à partir de vaisseaux cutanés)

des atteintes des veines pelviennes , de la VCI, des veines rénales et surrénales , des **artères pulmonaires** ont été rapportés , ainsi que des localisations distantes : **cerveau , os**, cœur et ganglions lymphatiques

le tableau révélateur peut être celui du myome utérin, un sd cave inférieur, une insuffisance cardiaque.. etc

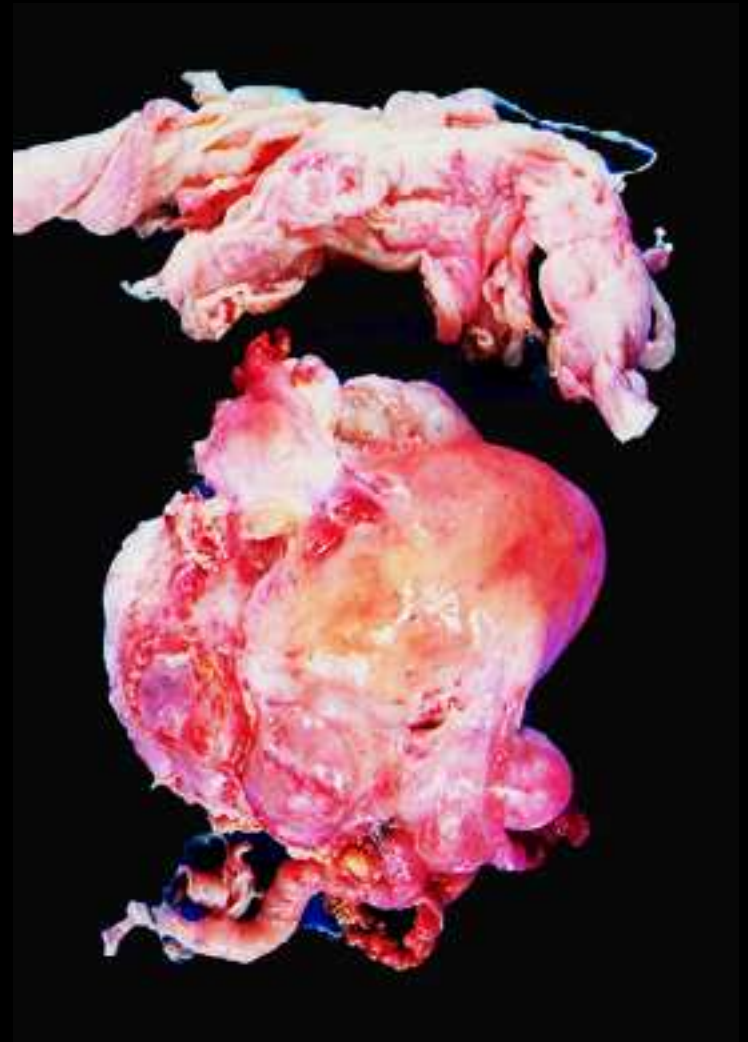


le traitement associe **chirurgie de résection** des segments atteints; hystérectomie et **ovariectomie** en raison de l'hormono dépendance .

Les **récidives** sont de l'ordre de **30%**

le **diagnostic différentiel** doit faire évoquer:

- les bourgeons tumoraux endoveineux du cancer du rein, de la tumeur de Wilms, du corticosurrénalome, -
- le leiomyosarcome primitif e la VCI ,
- le LMNH et le sarcome des tissus mous ,
- la fibrose rétropéritonéale ...
